

TOO NARROW THESIS STATEMENTS

When it seems that your thesis may be too narrow, more research can help you to broaden it. Consider the following examples of thesis statements and.

Asking who, what, when, where, and why about your thesis and your subject will enable you to identify a thesis that is too broad, and can help you to understand what you want to write about. The thesis statement contains this claim or focus and a list of main points the paper will discuss. Consider the following working thesis statement: America needs to reduce emissions of greenhouse gases, and there are many ways to do so. What is harmful? The Thesis Statement also lets the reader know the order in which your ideas will be expressed. Just Do It! But before you draw this conclusion you should try to rethink your topic, for example by searching Google or Google Scholar. From this statement, we know that I like dogs, and I do present a reason. This thesis is more specific and defensible than the original, broad thesis. This thesis is more specific than the preceding example, but is it too narrow? Media violence is harmful to society. Write down a brief version of your thesis and then jot down the three points that will support it. It is a forceful statement written in confident, firm language. Nothing can function the way that it is supposed to when the backbone is missing or broken. On the right, I have written a stronger thesis statement that is not an announcement, only advances one idea, is neither too broad nor too narrow and provides the reader with a blueprint. The writer will likely want to narrow it before beginning the research or drafting steps of the writing process. The thesis sentence restricts and controls the ideas that are covered in a longer paper. After you have written a thesis statement, it is very important to support it with specific evidence. Ask Questions The most practical way to focus a thesis statement is to ask questions about it. You can also try using more general keywords, synonyms, similar expressions and related information. Narrowing a Thesis One thing that the best academic essays have in common is a very specific thesis. In the statement above, the reader is asked to focus on two separate points, each of which more logically belongs in an essay of its own. You can also choose to add a blueprint or essay map to your thesis statements. Do you feel better about thesis statements? Strong Thesis Example: Cats make great pets because they are fun to watch, independent, and low maintenance. To do so, he or she can ask some questions about it: What are you arguing, and who are you trying to convince?
